- c. Outdoor Classroom
 - i. A project over the last few years that has been completed
 - ii. Started with a \$5 000 grant, accessed \$25 000 outdoor education grant, \$10 000 Millbrook donation, SAC funds in the past, \$5 000 Student grant
- d. Grade 6 Provincial Assessments
 - i. Took place in October over four days
 - ii. Results being released
- e. Grade 8 Provincial Assessments
 - i. Took place in June 2022 over four days
 - ii. Results received last month
- f. Technology
 - CCRCE schools were one-to-one Chromebooks the past two years; this
 has changed region wise due to the expiry of Chromebooks
 - ii. Goal is one-to-two ratio, which we are very close
- g. Bussing
 - i. Continues to be a challenge for the school and the Region, both in staffing and in sending notifications as to which busses are not running
- h. Safe Arrival Program
 - Part of round two of a pilot project; development of an app that allows parents to excuse their child's absence
 - Parents receive notifications (email/texts) for any students that are marked Absent Without Notification
 - ii. Getting mixed reviews so far; Carrie shared that at Truro Elementary, some teachers feel there is a missed connection with families if they excuse through the app versus contacting the office or the teacher and sometimes giving reasons behind it

6. Student Success Plan

- a. Short cycles of impact
 - i. Looking at needs/pre-data, making a plan, delivering instruction, re-looking at post-data,
 - ii. Six week timeframes approximately
 - iii. SSP following the same cycle
- b. To be responsive to the social, emotional and learning needs of each individual student's well-being and achievement
 - i. Reading, Mathematics & Well-Being
 - 1. Regional goal of building Mathematics understanding
 - a. Using *Building Thinking Classrooms* as a guide for professional learning
 - 2. Culturally Responsive/Well-Being
 - a. Exploratories starting in January
 - i. Three sessions from January to June
 - ii. 5-6 weeks each
 - iii. Thursdays approx 100 minutes
 - 1. Helping students grow in a skill
 - 2. Increasing student sense of belonging
 - Increasing sense of school community amongst students and staff
 - 4. Increasing life experiences for students
